

Resolution 19-055

**A Resolution Addressing Application of the International Building Code
with Respect to the Proposed Detention Center Expansion
by Brookings County**

Whereas, the County of Brookings is proposing to construct an expansion of the Brookings County Detention Center in the City of Brookings upon the site of the current detention center; and

Whereas, the County of Brookings has not applied for a building permit for the proposed construction and has expressed its position that a building permit is not required for this County construction project; and

Whereas, the City of Brookings in 2015 adopted by ordinance a building code as published by the International Code Council to promote public safety and the general welfare; and

Whereas, a building permit is required under the International Building Code for any project of the size and nature of the proposed expansion of the County Detention Center; and


Whereas, the City of Bookings on the advice of counsel has determined that neither State law nor city ordinance provide an exception for a County building project to the City's requirement that a building permit is required for new construction within the city limits of the City of Brookings; and

Whereas, Brookings County has previously applied to the City of Brookings for a building permit in connection with renovation at the Brookings County Courthouse, and the City has previously issued a building permit for that project under a previous version of the International Building Code.

Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved: (1) that by this Resolution the City of Brookings gives notice to Brookings County that its construction plans for the Brookings County Detention Center require a building permit before construction may begin; and (2) that the City authorizes the retention of outside legal counsel for the purpose of taking necessary legal action to enforce the City's building code.



