

Brookings Historic Preservation Plan

PROJECT OVERVIEW

The City of Brookings boasts an extraordinary richness of cultural and historic resources that represent the span of the city's history. The community has taken steps to protect and preserve its historic and cultural heritage, including the designation of districts and individual historic resources on the National Register of Historic Places, the operation of a Historic Preservation Commission, the maintenance of Downtown Design Guidelines, and presenting annual awards for historic preservation, among other efforts.



In order to continue these efforts, the City of Brookings has contracted with Winter & Company to complete a Historic Preservation Plan. This Plan will analyze the current preservation program and identify a community vision for preservation in the coming years. This will include recommendations for the historic preservation program components including program administration, historic resources identification methods, existing plans and policies that help manage the program, incentives and benefits, and how to work with educators and advocates.

PROJECT TIMELINE

The preservation plan will be completed in three phases, as seen below. The first phase will be completed by April 2020, with the second and third phases to follow dependent on funding.
